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For the last months, we tried to identify some of the main challenges faced by educational professionals to tackle school disengagement and dropout. Based on previous studies and European research, we selected some training areas that emerged as essential to explore the most important competencies to motivate young people completing their schooling. Therefore, Module 1 will focus on measures, attitudes and strategies to prevent ESL/ELET, while Module 2 will focus on action to intervene with 18 to 24 year old young adults who left school before compulsory education.

Over last few months, the project partners were working on the development of the content for the IO3 – ICT Tool for Competence Assessment – the psychometric tool for assessing a person's level of competence and identifying development needs. Based on the literature review and need analysis, 10 competencies were selected as relevant for the current Early Leavers from Education and Training (aged 18-24). Then, the pool of self-assessment statements per each competence was developed by the experts in the project countries in accordance with the guidelines provided by the OIC Poland Foundation. Currently, the accuracy assessment of statements is carried out in all project countries.

The partners have agreed on the guidelines to develop the online platform, established in the education platform user manual. The online platform serves as an e-learning environment and a reference point for the training material developed within the project.



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
