

FAST CHECK

Act of verifying the information in a nonfictional text in order to determine the veracity

1.CHECK THE CONTENT

Read very carefully to see if the data is accurate.

Check if the opinion is impartial

2.CHECK THE WEBSITE

Check "Contact" and "About us" sections

Investigate URLs (sometimes they mimic the originals)

3.CHECK THE AUTHOR

Have they written other articles?

5 STEPS AGAINST FAKE NEWS

Critical thinking

4.CHECK THE SOURCE

Are the sources authentic?

Are the people mentioned real?

5.CHECK PICTURES



- 3. RIGHT-CLICK ON THE PICTURE
- 4. CLICK ON GOOGLE IMAGE SEARCH


FALSE TITLE (has been used in the past)
